## **APSORC25 Copyright-Related Guidelines**

To organize APSORC25 and publish the proceedings, APSORC25 Local Organizing Committee (LOC) has established the following guidelines regarding copyright-related matters that APSORC25 presenters are requested to comply with.

### I. Governing Law

All presentations at APSORC25 and publication of the abstracts and proceedings are subject to the laws of Japan regarding copyright. An overview of the copyright system under Japanese law can be found on the following web page (<a href="https://www.cric.or.jp/english/csj/">https://www.cric.or.jp/english/csj/</a>). Japan has ratified the Berne Convention (<a href="https://www.wipo.int/treaties/en/ip/berne/">https://www.wipo.int/treaties/en/ip/berne/</a>) and the WIPO Copyright Treaty (<a href="https://www.wipo.int/treaties/en/ip/wct/">https://www.wipo.int/treaties/en/ip/wct/</a>).

## 2. Copyright Attribution

The copyright of APSORC25 presentations belongs to the presenters and/or their employers. The copyright of the abstracts and proceedings manuscripts shall be transferred to the LOC from the copyright holders. If copyright transfer is not possible due to legal restrictions or other reasons, the authors shall agree that the LOC or a third party contracted by the LOC will publish the abstracts and proceedings before submitting the manuscript.

## 3. Application of the CC License to the Abstracts and Proceedings

The abstracts and proceedings are licensed under the CC BY-NC license in principle, a Creative Commons license initiated by Creative Commons, an international non-profit organization that promotes the proper citation and reuse of copyrighted materials. The CC BY-NC license can be omitted if the authors indicate that they do not wish the license to be applied. ### 4. Respect for the Copyrights of Others

Presenters at APSORC25 should respect the copyrights of previously published materials and works. When using them in your presentations or manuscripts, you should indicate the source and cite them appropriately.
