

Policies for APSORC presentation

1. This text addresses the basic and common understanding for the presentations in APSORC conferences.
2. Presentations should be in line with the aims of APSORC and covered by either the regular sessions or the special/proposed sessions, and the scope of the presentations is expected to be wide-ranging, from the fundamentals such as the exploration of principles and mechanisms, to the development of methodologies, the design and development of devices and facilities, and their applications. The format should be a previously unpublished paper (including papers that focus on data) or a review paper by a single or multiple authors. If it is a review paper, please specify this clearly.
3. Presentations must be based on the ethics and scientific integrity of the scientist or researcher.
 - ✓ Presentations contrary to public order and morals will not be accepted.
 - ✓ Presentations should at least be based on common understandings and practices in the research community in each country.
 - ✓ Presentations must be based on the Code of Ethics advocated by the World Conferences on Research Integrity, or their equivalent documents. Please refer the following site on the web; <https://www.wcrif.org/> .
 - ✓ We do not accept presentations that involve a conflict of interest, which refers to financial or non-financial benefits that conflict with an individual's actions or decisions when conducting scientific activities.
 - ✓ The Local Organizing Committee (LOC) will be the point of contact in the case of allegations of research misconduct.
4. Artificial intelligence (AI) is not recognized as an author of the presentation. Therefore, AI cannot be a co-author. In addition, APSORC will not accept presentations that are almost entirely created by AI.
5. If Artificial Intelligence is used in research, this must be appropriately stated in the abstract, etc.
6. Please make your presentation in the style and format specified by APSORC25 LOC.
7. The LOC and International Advisory Committee will make the final decision on whether to accept the presentation. Even if your presentation is approved, if the LOC judges that there is a suspicion of a violation of the above guidelines, your presentation may be canceled.
